### **Individual should be able to:**

- Develop appropriate and supportive relationships with all students to keep them engaged in the program and support their individual growth and development.
- Help individual students or small groups of students maintain and build skills in language arts/reading and math. Set goals with students.
- Involve students in engaging experiential learning activities. Make learning exciting, relevant and creative.
- Ensure that all students receive courteous, prompt and professional attention.
- Maintain all equipment and supplies in good condition; return all equipment issued to you at the completion of the program.
- Always maintain a safe atmosphere and supervision of students. For incidents and accidents, seek out Director of Education.
- Provide feedback to Director of Education on students' needs and progress and opportunities to improve the program.
- Promote RodneyStreet program to the community, directing interested students to the appropriate staff.
- Attend all scheduled training sessions.
- Communicate with Director of Education in advance if unable to attend the program.
